Schedule of Meetings Of Demonstration Club

The Home Demonstration Club meeting for the month of June will be given over entirely to "Home Care of the Sick". Every woman and girl in the county are urged to attend the meeting in the community nearest her. The demonstration will be given by Miss Pearl Weaver, County School Nurse. Methods and practices that can be applied directly in the home have carefully been planned. These meetings are of much importance because of the war emergency and the scarcity of doctors.

Circumstances today—in a nation at war demand that every homemaker prepare herself and her home for unexpected emergencies. More than ever before she may have to depend on herself, her equipment, and her skill. Nurses and doctors are serving with the armed forces. Daily, fewer professionally trained persons are left to serve the local communities. Therefore, every homemaker should give immediate attention to preparing her home for care of the sick.

The well organized home is prepared to cope with emergencies brought about by illness or accident as well as to maintain the health of each other member of the family. The efficient homemaker will not wait until such an emergency arises, but will give sufficient study in advance to providing the necessary equipment and readjustment of the daily routine of family life that the change to emergency condition may be made quickly and with as little disturbance as possible.
