One of the country's most noted black bass centers is Hiwassee Lake, a 6,500 acre body of water bordering Murphy and formed by the impounding of water in the famous Hiwassee Dam. This lake, about 15 miles long and with 150 miles of shore-line, attracted several hundred fishermen on the opening of the Black Bass season, June 10. The strings of fish taken from the Lake fully justify the reputation of Cherokee County as an anglers' paradise. Last year's record black bass ran eight pounds, while it is the usual thing to hook four and five pound beauties.
