Ball And Shope Creeks Closed To All Trout Fishermen

Due to the large number of fish caught in Ball and Shope creeks of the Standing Indian Cooperative Game Area it has been found necessary to close these two streams to all trout fishing for the remainder of the season. This closure goes into effect immediately.

It is the policy of the State Game and Fish Commission, in cooperation with the U .S. Forest Service, to regulate fishing on streams within the cooperative game manage ment areas in such a manner as to insure perpetual good fishing and to prevent total exhaustion of fish in any streams. All other streams within the game areas on the Nantahala National Forest continue to be open on prescribed dates as advertised at the beginning of the season.
