

#### Salmon in a Mold or Loaf Spiced With a Bit of Cayenne

By BETSY NEWMAN

MANY OLD recipes call for a dash of cayenne pepper. I think it was used a good deal more half a century or less ago than it is today. However, a dash of it · very good in certain dishes, and maybe it would be a good thing to revive the habit.

When there are children in the family I believe in keeping condiments down to a minimum, and be sure not , o get too much cayenne even in dishes for adults. A pinch best describes the amount, but not too big a pinch. Paprika is a good substitute, as it is milder.

Today's Menu Salmon in Mold · Salmon Loaf Creamed or Scalloped Po'atoes

Frozen or Canned Green Peas Molded Tomato Salad Lemon Rice Pudding Tea Salmon in Mold Imon ½ c. fine bread 1 can salmon 2 eggs Chopped parsley 4 tbsp. melted butter or Chopped parsley dash of cayenne

add seasonings, 1 tsp. s.lt, 1/16 tsp. pepper, dash of cayenne, pars-ley. Last, add the beaten eggs. Put into buttered mold, and set in a pan of hot water; cover pan and let steam in the oven, keeping the water at boiling tomperature and replenishing it as it evaporates. Cook 1 hr. Turn out on hot plat-ter and serve with cream sauce to ter and serve with cream sauce to which chopped, hard-cooked eggs have been added. Serves 6.

Salmon Loaf 1 can salmon 11/2 c. fine bread 4 eggs, beaten light crumbs 14 . . p. salt Pepper and cayenne

4 tbsp. melted butter or margarine

Remove bones from fish, pick-ing over carefully, add butter or margarine, mixing until smooth. Beat crumbs into eggs and season before working trgether. Put all into greased mold and steam 1 hr.

Sauce for Salmon Loaf % c. butter or margarine Yolks 2 eggs Juice 1 lemon margarine butter or cayenne margarine Mix all over hot water and add t c. boiling water.
