Training Program For Ground Force Troops Announced

The Army Ground Forces six-year plan for the training of approximately 571,195 ground force troops of the National Guard of the United States has been announced by Lieutenant General Oscar W. Griswold, Commanding General, Seventh Army, operative in the 3rd Army Area.

In announcing the plan, General Griswold emphasized that actual training of the National Guard will continue to a function of each state. However, the Army Ground Force will detail Regular Army instructors, under the supervision of the Armies, who will be responsible for the supervision of the training programs. These instructors will be assigned to units down to and including the battalion level.

The six-year plan, which provides for the progressive instruction of units in each state, is designed to standardize the training of the National Guard all over the country. During the first and second years individuals and units will be trained on a company level; during the third and fourth years on a battalion level; during the fifth year on a regimental combat team and combat command level; and during the sixth year on a division level. The plan will go into effect when individual organizations reach an established quota of 45% of the required number of enlisted personnel and 80% of the required number of officers.

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Town of Andrews, by Ordinance duly adopted and pursuant to Chapter 1006, Laws of the General Assembly of North Carolina, Session of 1945, by its governing body has prohibited the sale of wine within the corporate limits of the Town of Andrews;

WHEREAS Town of Andrews and Town of Murphy are the only two incorporated municipalities in Cherokee County, North Carolina, and it is desired and deemed advisable by this Board to have the law with reference to the sale of wine uniform through Cherokee County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, North Carolina, in regularly adjourned meeting duly assembled on this the 15th day of July, 1946:

Section 1. That the sale of wine be and it is hereby prohibited in Cherokee County.

Section 2. That from and after this date it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale wine in Cherokee County, North Carolina; Provided, all persons, firms and corporations now engaged in the lawful sale of wine with proper li-

censes shall have thirty days from and after the effective date of this resolution, to-wit, thirty (30) days from and after July 15th, 1946, in which to sell and dispose of their stocks now on hand.

Section 3. That this ordinance and resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after July 15th, 1946.

Section 4. That any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished as provided by said Chapter 1006, Laws of 1945, above referred to.

Highlights of Regular Army Enlistment

- Enlistments for 1½, 2 or 3 years. (One-year enlistments permitted for men now in the Army with 6 or more months of service.)
- Enlistment age from 18 to 34 years inclusive (17 with parents' consent) except for men now in Army, who may reenlist at any age, and former service men depending on length of service.
- A reenlistment bonus of \$50 for each year of active service since such bonus was last paid, or since last entry into service, provided reenlistment is within 90 days after last honorable discharge.
- Up to 90 days' reenlistment furlough with pay, depending on length of service, with prescribed travel allowance paid to home and return, for men now in the Army who reenlist.
- Consult your Army Recruiting Officer for other furlough privileges.
- Mustering-out pay (based upon length of service) to all men who are discharged to enlist or reenlist.
- Option to retire at half pay for the rest of your life after 20 years' service—increasing to three-quarters pay after 30 years' service. (Retirement income in grade of Master or First Sergeant up to \$185.63 per month for life.) All previous active federal military service counts toward retirement.
- Benefits under the GI Bill of Rights assured for men who enlist on or before October 5, 1946.
- Choice of branch of service and overseas theater (of those still open) on 3-year enlistments.
