ANDREWS — Carolyn Smith, sixteen year old Andrews high school 4-H girl, was a winner of the blue ribbon and first prize at the State Fair, in the clothing contest. This is the second Andrews high school student within a few years to win a first place in 4-H work, Sammy Russell having won first place in 1942 in the baby beef contest.

Miss Smith's ensemble consisted of a woolen suit with blouse and accessories including hat, shoes and gloves. Her first place was worth a \$25 war bond to her, and also gave her the right to compete

in the State Clothing Achievement contest, she being one of five in this group the winner of which will have an all-expense trip to Chicago.

This Andrews girl is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Smith. She has been in 4-H work for four years, and was president of the local club last year and was also president of the Cherokee county Council. The past summer she attended a 4-H short course at State College in Raleigh.

For other 4-H work she has completed creditable projects in room improvement, gardening, and food conservation. She is now a tenth grade student in the local high school where she has an excellent scholastic record.
