

## Summer Fuel Buying Is Urged

Taking notice of a nation-wide program of summer fuel buying launched recently by the Secretary of the Interior with an appeal to Government agencies, industrial and residential consumers, Defense Transport Administrator James K. Knudson, issued a statement underscoring the transportation aspects of that program.

Administrator Knudson noted that widespread suffering was prevented last winter by near miracles in transportation and warned that the mounting burden of defense and defense supporting traffic will, by this fall and winter, make such heavy demands upon the nation's transport capacity as to create the unlikely prospect that relief can promptly be provided for spot areas in distress. The normal peak movement occurring in October and November must this year, he said, be spread over a longer period including the summer months.
