

# C. W. Gordon, Lumber Dealer Dies Monday

Funeral services for Chandler W. Gordon, 43, prominent lumber dealer and civic leader of Asheville, who died early Monday following a long illness, were held at 2 p. m. Wednesday in the First Presbyterian Church of Asheville.

The Rev. C. Crier Davis officiated and burial was in Riverside Cemetery.

Gordon was a native of Asheville, the son of the late Clarence and Lucy Walker Gordon, and a brother of Bruce Gordon of Murphy.

He was president of the Gordon Lumber Company of Asheville, and up until the time of his sudden illness last summer, he was active in civic and religious life of the community. He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church, served as a deacon and was chairman of the board of deacons in 1949 and 1950, and had recently been elected for a second term.

He was president of the Asheville Rotary Club and served as district treasurer from 1948 through 1950, and was governor of Rotary's 280th district when he became ill.

Surviving are the widow; a son, Thomas Phelps Gordon; two daughters, Linda Sue and Winifred Ann Gordon, all of Asheville; three brothers, J. Bruce Gordon of Murphy, Cmdr. Clarence E. Gordon, USN, stationed in Little Creek, Va., and Gill Gordon of Phenac, Ind., a sister, Mrs. Grace Maness; his stepmother, Mrs. C. E. Gordon, also of Asheville and an aunt, Miss Ada Gordon, who has made her home with the Gordons for many years.
