

Federation Pays \$2 1-2 Million For Poultry

The Farmers Federation Market Department is paying the Farmers of Western North Carolina over two and one half million dollars a year for poultry and poultry products, stated Jimmy McCure Clarke, executive vice-president, at the annual meeting of the stockholders for Cherokee County held Saturday in the Murphy warehouse.

Clarke went on to explain that the bulk of this was for broilers and heavy hens, and that a large percent of the heavy hens came from Cherokee County.

Bryan Collins, Farm Management Specialist of the N. C. Extension service, gave a report of the distribution of T. V. A. Fertilizer and Fertilizer materials in the T. V. A. watershed.

G. H. Farley, county agent, told the stockholders present of the 4-H club pullet chain sponsored by Farmers Federation in cooperation with the Extension Service of Cherokee County. The Farmers Federation is furnishing ten boys and girls 100 sexed pullets to be grown out.

Max Roberts, educational director, told the members that the Asheville-Burley market led all the other burley markets in the highest average price.

The Rev. Dumont Clarke gave a report on the past year's activities of the Lord's Acre Work. He went on to explain that the Farmers Federation was the only Cooperative that he knew of which had a Religious Department.

W. A. Adams was elected to serve with J. H. Hampton as director of the Federation from Cherokee County.
