### Champion Effects 7,000 Families

The utilization of forest products by the Canton Division of The Champion Paper and Fibre Company to produce paper, paperboard and related by-products, has been directly responsible for the economic welfare of more than 7,000 families throughout Western North Carolina during the past year, according to H. A. Helder, Champion's division manager, who places heavy emphasis on the importance of the various forestry programs being conducted throughout the WNC area this spring.

A survey just completed by J. E. Keener, manager of Champion's woods department, reveals that the total value of wood purchased by the Canton division during 1951 amounted to \$8,928,000. Of this amount nearly four million dollars, or more than 43 percent of the total, went directly to woodlot owners and other pulpwood suppliers in Western North Carolina.

The procurement of these timber products for Champion's use provided employment in the WNC area for 1500 families on a full-time basis, and for 3,000 families on a part-time basis. The latter are the small wood-lot owners who harvest their timber periodically for a cash crop.

In addition to these, more than 2,500 families derive full-time employment at Champion's Canton plant in the conversion of forest products to paper and paper board.

### Announce Fishing Schedule In Nantahala Area

The U. S. Forest Service recently announced the 1952 fishing schedule for Nantahala National Forest Cooperative Wildlife management areas. Location of the areas are: Cliffside Lake, between Franklin and Highlands; Fires Creek, four miles north of Hayesville; Santeetlah, 18 miles northwest of Robbinsville. U. S. Highway 129; Standing Indian, 14 miles southwest of Franklin; Wayah, eight miles west of Franklin.

Open dates are: April, 15-16, 19-20, 24-25, 28, 30-31; June, 1, 4, 7, 8, 11, 14-15, 18, 21-22, 25, 28-29; July, 2, 4-5, 6, 9, 12-13, 16, 19-20, 23, 26-27, 30; August, 2-3, 6, 9, 10, 13, 16-17, 20, 23-24, 27, 30-31.

Cliffside Lake will be open daily from June 1 through August 31. Due to logging and road building operations on Fires Creek Wildlife Management Area cars will not be permitted in the area beyond the checking station on Wednesdays. Fishermen entering the area will do so at their own risk.

Daily permits are required. Fishing will be permitted between 9 a. m. and one hour after sunset, except on Cliffside Lake where fishing will be permitted Monday through Friday from 9 a. m. until one hour after sunset. Creel limit is ten fish per day.

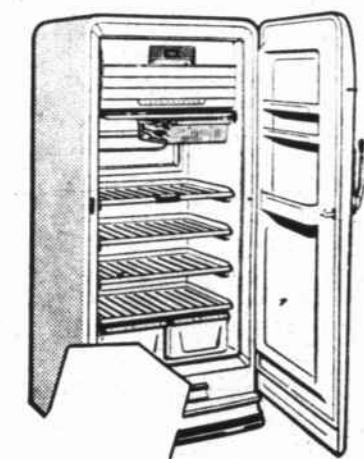
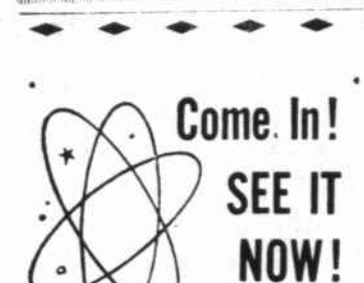
