

#### **Champion Effects** 7.000 Families

The utilization of forest products by the Canton Division of The Champion Paper and Fibre Company to produce paper pa-perboard and related by-products. as been directly responsible for the economic welfare of more than 7 000 families throughout Western orth Carolina during the past ear, according to H. A. Helder, Champion's division manager, who caces heavy emphasis on the importance of the various forestry programs being conducted throu-shout the WNC area this spring.

A survey just completed by J F. Keener, manager of Champ-ion's woods department, reveals that the total value of wood pur-chased by the Canton division dur ing 1951 amounted to \$8,928,000.-00. Of this amount nearly four million dollars, or more than 43 percent of the total, went directly to woodlor owners and other pulpwood suppliers in Western North Carolina.

The procurement of these timber products for Champion's use provided employment in the WNC area for 1500 families on a fulltime basis, and for 3,000 families on a part-time basis. The latter are the small wood-lot owners who harvest their timber periodically for a cash crop

In addition to these, more than 2.500 families derive full-time employment at Champion's Canton plant in the conversion of forest products to paper and paper board.
