SUIT. "A Model Mile" of roadside and home-yard improvements along the highway in this community has been one of the Suit H. D. Club's most successful projects. Making hooked rugs, reading for Book Certificate awards, and clothing projects are among the club members' present interests.

SUNNY POINT. Sponsorship of community projects such as better school buildings, and beautification of homes and roadsides, are included in the Sunny Point club's activities. The club was formed in 1942.

TOMOTLA. Several members of this club have missed only a few meetings during the group's 15-year existence. For three years

in a row, the Tomotla club has had a booth at the County Fair.

VALLETTOWN. A scrapbook containing news about the Valleytown H. D. Club since its organization in 1938 has been kept by Mrs. C. S. Freel. It is a prized possession of the club and its contents show the group's work on many home and community improvement projects.

VIOLET. The recent construction of a rural electric line to the Violet community has caused H. D. club women here to concentrate their latest efforts on home improvement by the installation of electric household appliances.

WOLF CREEK. One of the two youngest clubs in the county, the Wolf Creek group organized November 7, 1951. Handicrafts, a study of financial planning and household budgeting, and establishment of a Nantahala Regional Library Bookmobile Station have been prominent among the club's initial activities.

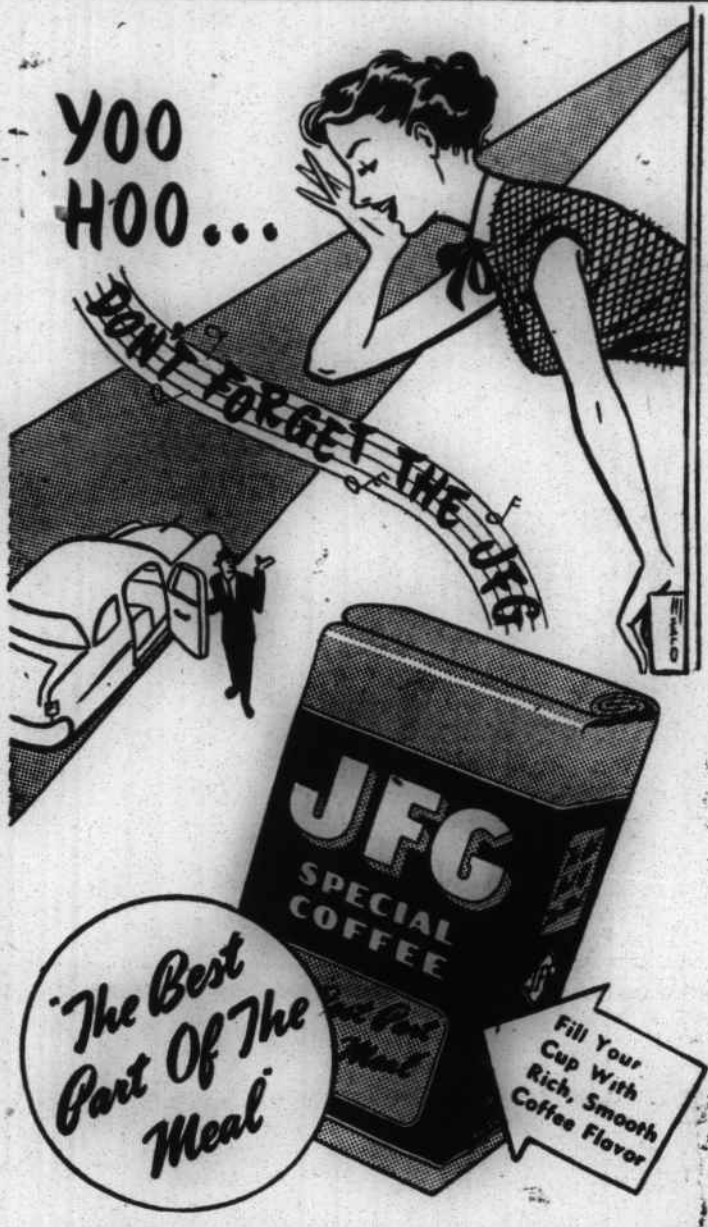

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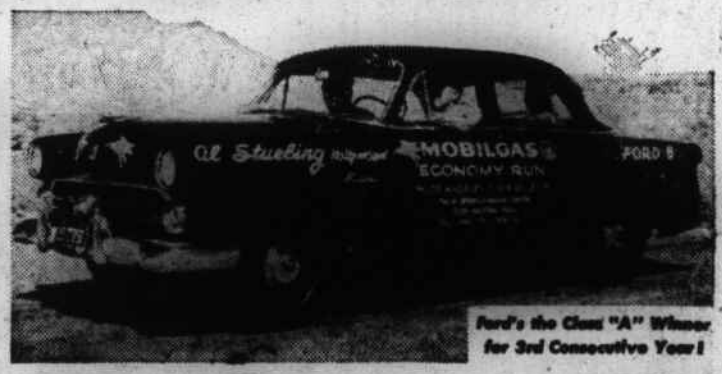
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
