# Dr. Donlan Gives Facts On Rabies

Beginning in May, everyone in Cherokee County will be given an opportunity to contribute to a community effort with real public health importance. All that you have to do is to take your dog to one of the many health department rabies clinics and have him vaccinated. The fee is one dollar and you are entitled to a refund when your dog tax is paid. This

is real health insurance for you. If you do not own a pet, ask your friends who do to cooperate for everyone's protection.

Rabies is a dangerous disease of man and animals. It is transmitted through the bite of a rabid animal. The cause of rabies is a tiny virus that is carried in the saliva of rabid animals. The saliva enters the body through a break in the skin, usually a dog or cat bite. Rabies does not always develop after a rabid animal bite but no one who has once developed rabies has ever recovered. Fortunately, medical science has given us a treatment that will prevent rabies after exposure, provided the course of treatment is begun soon enough. This method of pre-

vention is far from ideal. Our most logical protection lies in controlling the spread of rabies in animals so that treatment will be unnecessary following dog bites. How can this be accomplished? Already countries such as England, Sweden, Denmark, have eliminated the disease by following these measures. It is a simple as this:

1. Rid the community of stray dogs. It is the unwanted stray dog that is never vaccinated and is most susceptible to rabies when introduced into a community.
  2. Vaccinate your dogs every year. The health department rabies clinics provide this service for you at a small fee.
  3. Report all cases of rabies or suspected rabies, to your health department.
  4. Cooperate with your health department in any measure deemed necessary to control an outbreak of rabies.
- The County Health Department earnestly solicits the cooperation of each and every citizen during this effort to make our community a healthier and safer place to live. Clinics will be located at points throughout the county where you can take your dog for inoculation. Watch for the announcement of the time and place of these clinics in your local paper.
