By virtue of authority vested in me by a Judgment of the Cherokee Superior Court dated the 7th day of May, 1952, in the above entitled action, I will, on Wednesday, the 2 day of July, 1952, at 12 o'clock noon at the Courthouse door in Murphy, North Carolina, offer for sale to the highest bidder for cash the following described lands in Valleytown Township, Cherokee County, N. C.:

**FIRST PARCEL:** Lots 10, 11 and 12 in Block "R" of the Town of Andrews, said lots being 50 x 140 feet each in size and located at the corner of Cherry and Fourth Streets.

Being what is known as the Margaret Holland McCraney dwelling house and being the lands described in a deed from Dr. W. H. Scruggs and wife, Elizabeth B. Scruggs, to Jack McCraney and wife, Margaret H. McCraney, dated March 28, 1948 and recorded in Book 166 at page 245, Records of Cherokee County, reference to which is hereby made.
