County People Buy Bonds Worth \$9,306.25 In May

County U. S. Savings Bonds Chairman, W. D. Whitaker announced recently that according to the monthly sales report from Allison James, State Director of Savings Bonds in Greensboro, sales of Series E, F, G, J and K Bonds in Cherokee County for the month of May totaled \$9,306.25; of this amount, \$9,306.25 were in Series E Bonds; none in Series F and G Bonds; none in Series J Bonds; and none in Series K Bonds.

Total sales of E, F, G, J, and K Bonds for North Carolina's 109 counties were \$2,704,652.25. Of this total, \$2,077,982.25 were in E Bonds; \$9,136 in F and G Bonds; \$101,034 in J Bonds; and \$516,500 in K Bonds.

In announcing the sales figures for F and G Bonds, Mr. Whitaker pointed out that the sale of Series F and G Bonds was discontinued April 30, but that the amounts shown were recorded too late to be included in the April sales report. The F and G Bonds were replaced by the J and K Bonds, respectively, which were first offered for sale May 1.

Attention was also called by Chairman W. D. Whitaker to the Series H Bond, a new addition to the Savings Bonds group. The H Bond, a current income bond available to individuals, became available June 1. It has an investment yield approximately equal to that of the Series E Bond. Interest is paid semi-annually by check after the first six months. The H Bond is issued at par and redeemable at par. Annual purchase limit of H Bonds registered in one name is \$20,000, with co-ownership provisions the same as which apply to Series E Bonds.

 The Misses Margaret and Mable Fisher have donated forty volumes of modern fiction to the Andrews Carnegie Library. The books are now available for patrons of the library.

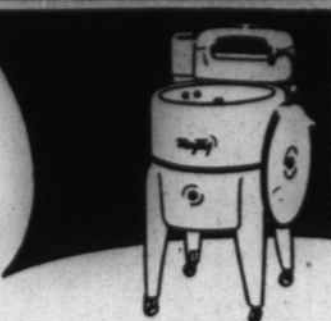
