S 276 at Wagon Road Gap; the new Mile High Swinging Bridge atop Grandfather Mountain; and Roan Mountain now reached by a new Forest Service road connecting with N. C. 261 (too new to be on most maps) leading north from Bakersville.

The new Great Smokies link connecting with Soco Gap-Mile High Overlook of the Blue Ridge Parkway-is also open. Visitors are finding more accommodations in full-scale operation than have remained open in October before.
