

## House Candidate Will Speak At Peachtree Community

Buel Adams, Cherokee County Republican candidate for the North Carolina House of Representatives in the Nov. 4 general election, will speak at 7:30 p. m. Thursday in the Peachtree Community.

Mr. Adams, a native of Cherokee County, was born in the Grand-

view section, moving to Murphy in 1922.

The former Murphy mayor attended local schools and the Sylva Collegiate Institute, Sylva, N. C.

He was employed for a short time by the Schnell Contracting Co. in Miami, Fla., and by the U. S. Coastal Geodetic Survey in

mapping Cherokee, Graham and Clay Counties.

He was employed for eight years by the Tennessee Valley Authority. In 1942 he entered the Navy and served with the 118th Naval Construction Battalion as chief petty officer under Lt. Comm. Beardon of Asheville. Mr. Adams was in service two and a half years with 23 months overseas duty.

He now owns and operates Adams' Machine Co. in Murphy.
