County Road Work Listed

Cherokee County had 1.7 miles of road improvement last month, Commissioner L. Dale Thrash of the State Highway said today.

Stabilization and strengthening the existing surface with traffic-bond and macadam was completed for 5 miles of Junaluska Road and 0.2 mile on Hayley Fields Road. The two projects were completed under the \$200,000,000 secondary road bond program.

The Tenth Highway Division brought a total of 126.8 miles of road work to completion during September, Commissioner Thrash revealed.

Clay County had 14 miles of new paving during the same period.

The newly-hardsurfaced roads, and their lengths are: Swanson Road, 0.3 mile; Dick Jones Road, 1.1 miles; Town Street, 0.4 mile; Gum Log Road, one mile; Pine Log Road, 0.70 mile; Downing Creek Road, 3.10 miles; Fires Creek Road, 1.20 miles; Long Prong Tusquitee Road, 2.35 miles; and Tusquitee Road, 3.85 miles.
