Under and by virtue of an order of the Superior Court of Cherokee County, made in the special proceeding entitled Abbie Maxine Roberts, et als, Petitioners, vs. Flossie Inman, et als, Defendants, the undersigned commissioner will, on the 30th day of May, 1953, at 2:00 p. m., at the location of the property on the new Blairsville Highway (Old Gold Branch Road) offer for sale to the highest bidder for cash five (5) certain parcels of land, all a part of what is known as the L. M. Reynolds property, in Notla Township Cherokee County, North Carolina, more particularly described as follows:

PARCEL NO. 1:
Beginning on a maple on a branch, corner of Everett Green and runs thence up said branch approximately 57 poles to a rock on the branch; thence South 51 West approximately 17 poles to the center of Blairsville Highway, thence with the center line of said highway South 25 East approximately 59 poles to the said Green line; thence with said line North 12 East approximately 9 poles to the beginning, containing 4.76 acres, more or less.

PARCEL NO. 2:
Beginning at a stake on the Northeast side of a branch and on the South side of Old Gold Branch Road, formerly a white oak old corner, and runs thence up said branch in a Northwest direction approximately 37 poles to a rock, corner Flossie Inman; thence with the Flossie Inman line North 56 East 22 poles to a rock corner of New Blairsville Highway; thence same direction to the center of said highway; thence South 25 East approximately 13 poles to the Everett Green line; thence with said line South 12 West approximately 35 poles to the beginning, containing 3.4 acres, more or less.

PARCEL NO. 3:
Beginning at a stake on the Northeast side of the branch, between said branch and the Old Gold Branch Road, formerly a white oak old corner, and runs up said branch in a Northwest direction approximately 37 poles to a rock corner Flossie Inman; thence with Flossie Inman line three (3) calls as follows: North 41 West 10 poles; North 6 West 11 poles; and North 56 West 8 poles to the Southeast margin of a roadway; thence with the Southeast margin of said roadway 13 West 4 1/2 poles; South 26 West 5 1/2 poles; and South 14 poles to a point in the center of the Old Gold Branch Road; thence with the center line of said three (3) calls; South 39 East 13 poles; South 55 East 15 poles; and South 67 East 17 poles to the beginning, containing 3.86

acres, more or less.

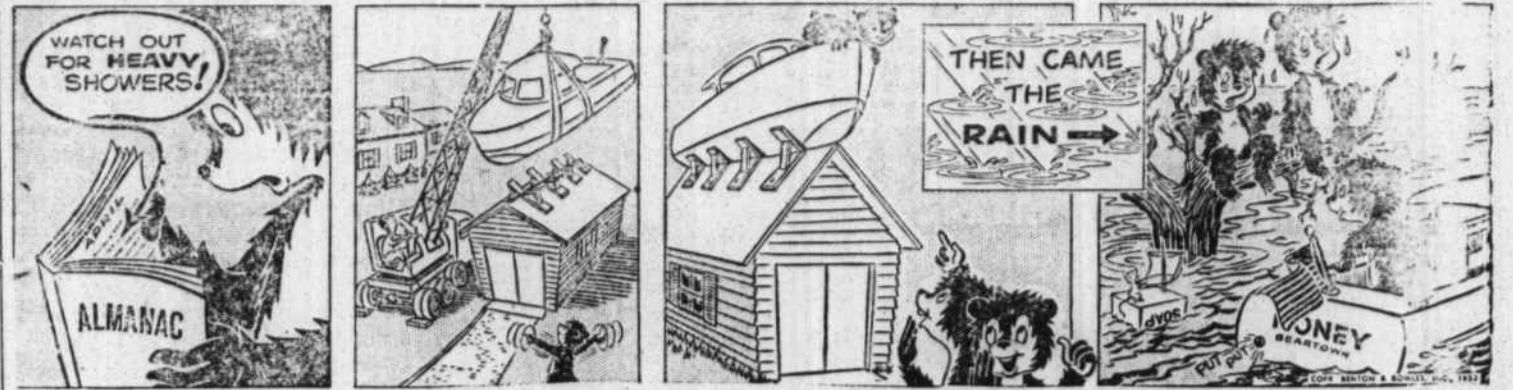

PARCEL NO. 4:
Beginning at a point in the center of the New Blairsville highway at the intersection of a roadway, Northeast corner of the Flossie Inman tract, and runs thence with the center line of said highway approximately 19 poles to the Henson line; thence with the said line South 51 West 3 poles to a stake on the Southwest side of said road; thence South 41 West 6 poles to a rock; thence North 55-30 West 12

poles to a post; thence North 85 West 5 1/4 poles to a stake on the South Bank of a road; thence with said road Westerly approximately 17 poles to a stake at a ravine opposite a post oak; thence down the ravine South 38 East 6 1/2 poles; South 54 East 10 1/2 poles; South 41 East 12 poles; South 18-30 East 8 poles and South 50 East 7 poles to a stake in the Northwest margin of a roadway; thence with the Northwest margin of said roadway; North 15 East 4 poles; North 69 East 5 poles; North 84 East 3 poles; and North 45 East 12 poles to the beginning, containing 5 acres, more or less.
