Henn Cleared In Beach Death

A young Murphy citizen recently was cleared by a coroner's jury of any responsibility in a recent freak auto death in Daytona Beach.

The jury ruled that Preston Henn, son of P. J. Henn of Murphy, was not responsible for the death of a 27-year-old Chattanooga, Tenn., man last July 20.

The victim, Guestile C. Duke, was asleep on the beach about six feet to the rear of Henn's auto. The Henn youth entered the car and

backed it up, passing partly over the sleeping Duke.

The wheels did not touch Duke, but shouts of nearby bathers suddenly awakened Duke and he raised up, striking his head on the under part of Henn's auto.

The victim died later in a hospital "from a broken neck bone that damaged the spinal cord."

The jury asserted Duke met his death "by mischance and accident."
