Average Local Family Said Insured For \$4,100

(Special to the Cherokee Scout) NEW YORK, Aug. 28—Residents of Cherokee County are large holders of life insurance, with a capital amount of \$17,500,000 in force, according to a breakdown of data from the statistics and research division of the Institute of Life Insurance.

This represents per family holdings of \$4,100 as of the end of 1952, an increase of about nine percent over the previous year.

The increase in the use of life insurance by American families is but one aspect of a pattern of thrift exhibited since the last World War. Savings accounts have risen in the period and investments in securities have gone up steadily, the study shows.

Despite the fact that funds invested in life insurance have increased 63 per cent since World War II, the premiums paid last year represented only 3.6 percent of aggregate disposable personal income, compared to 4.9 percent then.

In Cherokee County the increase in ownership of life insurance has not been noted in all categories—ordinary insurance group and industrial—with ordinary maintaining the largest volume although group recorded the biggest percentage gain. The local breakdown shows 56 percent of the volume in ordinary life policies.

Women's ownership of life insurance has been sharply increased in recent years. They now hold almost one-fifth of the total, with coverage of children accounting for another seven per cent.

Men, however, remain the great body of policy holders, accounting for nearly 75 per cent of the total.

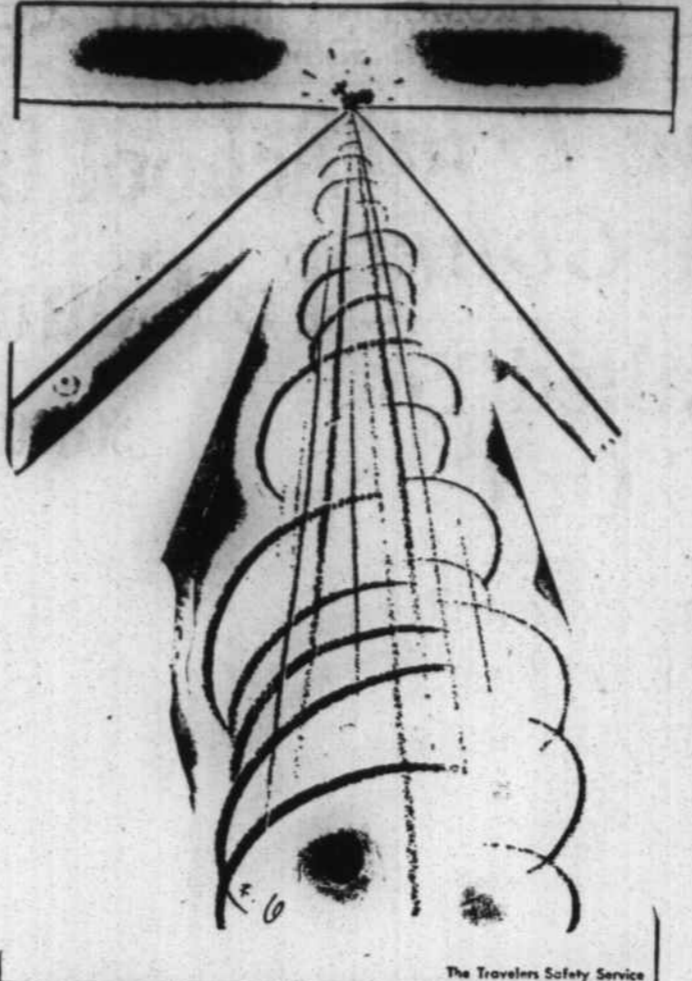
