Farm Outlook Meet Slated For Cherokee County Soon

Cherokee County agricultural workers and leaders will get the latest information on what to expect on the farm front next year at a meeting in Murphy, at 10 a.

m., Nov. 13, at the courthouse.

G. H. Farley, county agent for the State College Agricultural Extension, said today that a series of 101 meetings will be held in 99 of the state's 100 counties this month, "to give the farm people information that will help adjust to the farming picture next year."

Mr. Farley said meetings will be held in every county except Craven.

The meetings will be conducted by five teams of farm management and marketing specialists from State College under the supervision of C. B. Ratchford, in charge of extension farm management and marketing, Farley said.

The outlook for tobacco, cotton, feed, feed grains, wheat, peanuts, soybeans, forest products, beef, hogs, sheep, poultry, dairying, fruit and nut trees, vegetables, farm costs, home furnishings, housing and household equipment, will come in for discussion, according to Farley.

The five teams of specialists, made up of Ratchford, D. D. Brown, Charles Williams, Guy Caswell, G. S. Abshier, J. M. Hunter, M. S. Williams, David Stencil John Curtis, and W. Turner, will conduct the meetings.
