Last week five candidates had filed on the Graham County board of elections books for sheriff, to enter the primaries, May 29.

F. O. Colvard of Tapoco, Lee Crawford, C. W. Cape and J. B. Crisp of Robbinsville will enter the Democratic primary and Earl W. Shuler has entered as Republican Candidate for sheriff. Crisp is the present sheriff.

Two Democrats have filed for the clerk of Court position—Jack H. (Billy Jack) Tatham and Bright Postell. Arvil Webster is present clerk, with W. M. Sherrill acting.

Mrs. Edna Jones Scroggs, incumbent, is thus far the only candidate filed for the register of deeds post. The three members comprising the Board of Graham County Commissioners have filed for re-election. They are: Tony P. Ayers, chair man, of Tapoco; F. J. Howell of Robbinsville and R. O. Sherrill of Yellow Creek.

W. N. George of Robbinsville; George R. Long of Rt. 1, Robbinsville; D. B. Ghormley, D. V. Massey and Wayne A. Ayers, all of Robbinsville, have also filed for the board. Harry Owens of Tapoco and Pearl Lovin of Stecoah, now on the board of education, have filed for re-election. Donald England of Cheoah has also filed for the education board.
