In addition to the regular textbook material, Arnold Beerkens of Holland and Murphy talked to the classes on steps toward becoming a naturalized citizen.

In connection with the study, Mrs. Bueck's class has an interesting exhibit in the school library.

Two documents are on display. One is the document granting citizenship to Hieronymus Bueck of Queckborn, Germany, great-grandfather of H. C. Bueck.

The other document was signed by Ludwig Duke of Hassen Dornstadt, releasing Hieronymus Bueck from loyalty and allegiance to his native Germany. Both documents have the date 1852.

Mr. Bueck lived in Schuylkill County, Penn. until his death in 1886.


