I AM IN FAVOR OF:

1. The repeal of the Act of 1933 which requires out-of-state fishermen to buy Non-Resident License or pay \$6.10 per day in order to be allowed to fish in North Carolina lakes and streams. 2. People over 60 years of age, and citizens of North Carolina to be allowed to fish and hunt without license.
3. The repeal of the so-called Secrecy Law passed by the last term of the General Assembly.
4. Encouraging young men and women to enter the field of Education by an increase in teacher's salaries of 10% and revision of the Teachers and State Employees Retirement System to a standard that will give them a monthly income in proportion to what similar employees would receive under Social Security.
5. Better roads, both main line highways and rural roads. I will cooperate with the Highway Commission and endeavor to get certain improvements, on U. S. Highway No. 64 all the way from Murphy to Highlands and through the entire 33rd District.
