## Bloodmobile Be In Robbinsville Wed.

The Red Cross Bloodmobile will be in Robbinsville Wednesday, June 2, Leonard Lloyd Red Cross Chapter, chairman said today.

The Bloodmobile will be at the American Legion Hall between the hours of 12:30 and 5 p. m.

Under the new blood program, Mr. Lloyd said, any person giving blood will receive a card, thereby protecting themselves and their family for the year. If blood is needed by the donor, or his family, they may present the card and be entitled to the blood without obligation.

Persons not having the blood donors' card, must pay the full cost of the blood along with the obligation to replace the blood.

It is necessary, Mr. Lloyd said, that the quota of 100 pints be reached for Graham County to maintain the blood program.

All persons are urged to give a pint of blood so that Graham County can keep its blood program. Any one needing transportation to the bloodmobile, or information concerning the blood program may contact Mrs. Fannie Jenkins, Baxter Campbell or Leonard Lloyd.

## Burley Rulings Are Announced

The penalty on excess Burley tobacco for 1954 may be 26c per pound. Section 314 of the Agricultural Adjustment Act of 1938, as amended, provides that the marketing of any kind of tobacco in excess of the farm marketing quota shall be subject to a penalty of 40 percent of the average market price for such kind of tobacco for the immediately preceding marketing year.

The Senate on May 4, 1954 passed a Bill to amend this provision to increase the penalty on the marketing of excess tobacco from 40 percent to 50 percent of the average market price for the immediately preceding marketing year. This Bill is now being considered in the House of Representatives. The Bill as passed by the Senate would become effective during 1954 on all kinds of tobacco.

The average marketing price on Burley tobacco for the 1953-54 marketing year was 52.5c per pound.
