Miss Patricia Thomason is home for the holidays from school in Winston Salem.

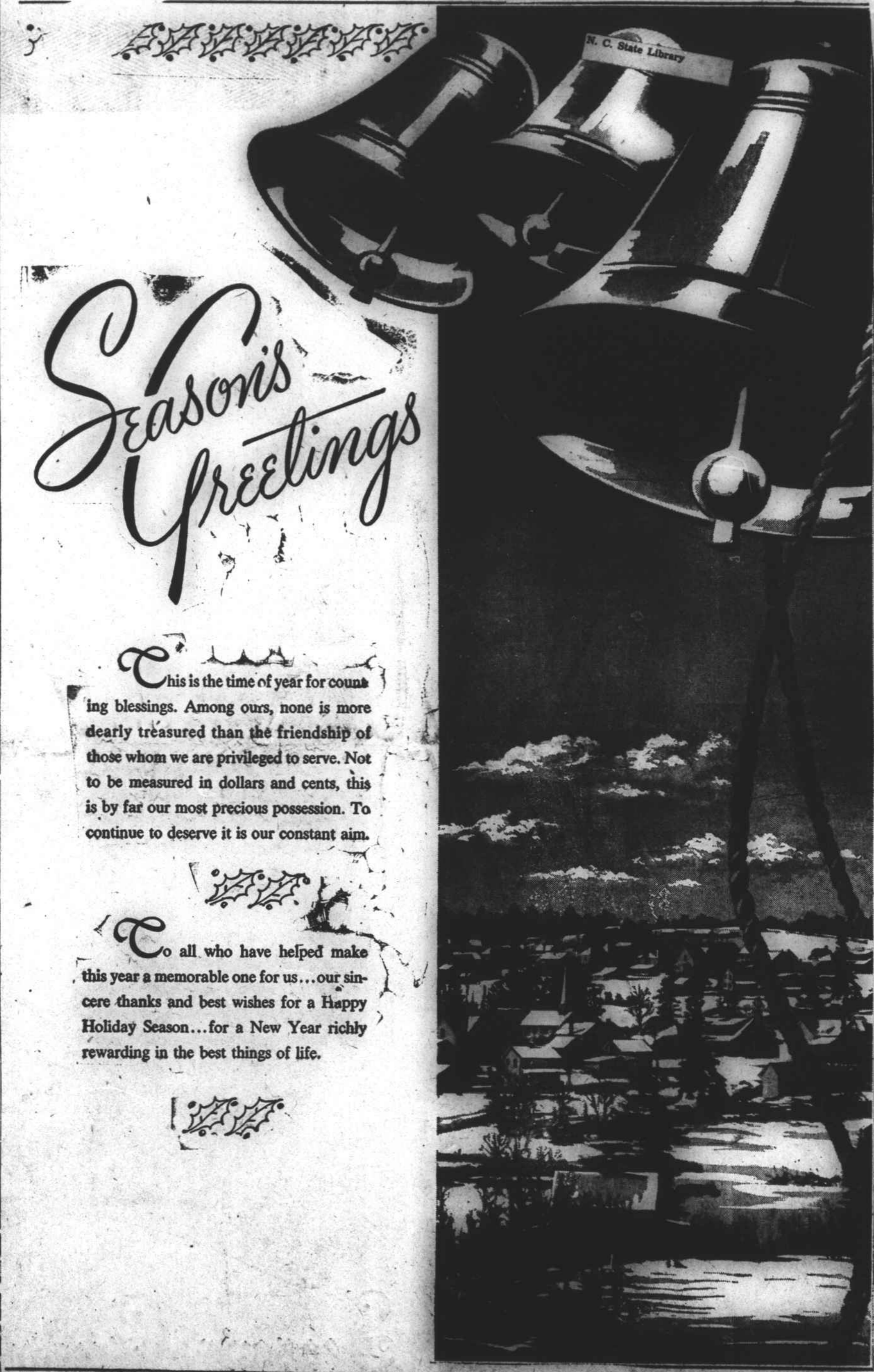
