The annual meeting of all Farmers Federation Stockholders will be held on the Buncombe County Courthouse, Asheville, on March 26, beginning at 10 a. m., it has been announced by James G. K. McClure, president of the 35 year old farm cooperative.

County directors nominated to serve two-year terms at each of the Farmers Federation regional stockholders meeting will be voted upon by the stockholders, and reports will be made by each of the Farmers Federation Department heads.

### Young Harris College Starts Expansion

The board of trustees of Young Harris College has approved a \$150,000 to \$300,000 building expansion program which will provide adequate facilities to meet the needs of an increased enrollment.

Immediate plans include the construction of a 40 unit boys' dormitory and a 60 unit girls' dormitory, a complete renovation and modernization of the College library, a new central heating plant, an expansion and extension of the water supply system, and an improvement of present dormitory accommodations.

The initiation of this building program has been accomplished through the generosity of alumni and interested friends of the College.

Scott Appley, chairman of the board of trustees, a loyal alumnus, and a native of Pendergrass, Ga., has contributed \$150,000 which is the most recent of numerous substantial gifts given by him to Young Harris.

A luncheon will be served to all who attend the meeting and arrangements have been made for a special tour of the poultry dressing plant, hatchery, freezer locker and Skyline Dairies.

The Farmers Federation String Band featuring Panhandle Pete and his one-man band act will be on hand to entertain.

Special buses will be provided to bring in stockholders from some of the distant counties.

A study in the St. Louis milkshed shows that high quality milk can be produced with an investment in building of only about \$200 per cow, 1950 prices, and with half the labor commonly used.

By the means of a considerable donation of an anonymous friend, the college library will be completely remodeled, modernized, and named in honor of the Hon. W. H. Duckworth, chief justice of the Georgia Supreme Court, an alumnus, and an active supporter of Young Harris.

Any additional funds that will be required for the completion of the building program will be raised by the Board of Trustees.

President C. R. Clegg stated that these modernized campus facilities will permit the admission of 100 additional students to the educational advantages of Young Harris College.
