ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING \$5,000 WATER BONDS OF THE TOWN OF ANDREWS BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Andrews, North Carolina:

Section 1. That pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, bonds of the Town of Andrews of the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$5,000 are hereby authorized to be issued for the purpose of enlarging and extending the Town's water system, the same being a necessary expense within the meaning of the Constitution.

Sec 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Sec. 3. That a statement of debt of the Town has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect 30 days after the first publication hereof unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under said Municipal Finance Act, in which event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 20th day of April, 1955, and was first published on the 28th day of April, 1955.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
