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Don't Graduate Into A Statistic

"Don't graduate into a statistic," was the way Highway Safety Director Major Charles A. Speed put it to Tar Heel young people today in advance of many high school parties planned for May and June.

"Graduation days should be happy days," the safety authority said. "Let's not suddenly change hilarity into hysteria with a tragic traffic accident."

Major Speed suggested some probable cause soft-teenage accidents during the school party season were: (1) Speed too fast for road and weather conditions; (2) Fatigue from unaccustomed late hours and the strain of examinations; (3) Inattention to driving because of the excitement of the occasion; (4) A daring attitude from a new "grown-up" feeling; (5) Too many passengers in the car, interfering with the driver; (6) Inexperience of drivers who may have the family car out for the first time.

"Some graduation parties will last well into the night," Major Speed pointed out. "Those early in-the-morning hours are especially dangerous driving hours. We hope that graduation into new responsibilities will keep our young drivers aware of the lives in their care."

"Slow down and live is the attitude we recommend for all drivers. I urge young people to remember that this year and always."

He also warned young drivers that they must have a valid driver's license with them when at the wheel.

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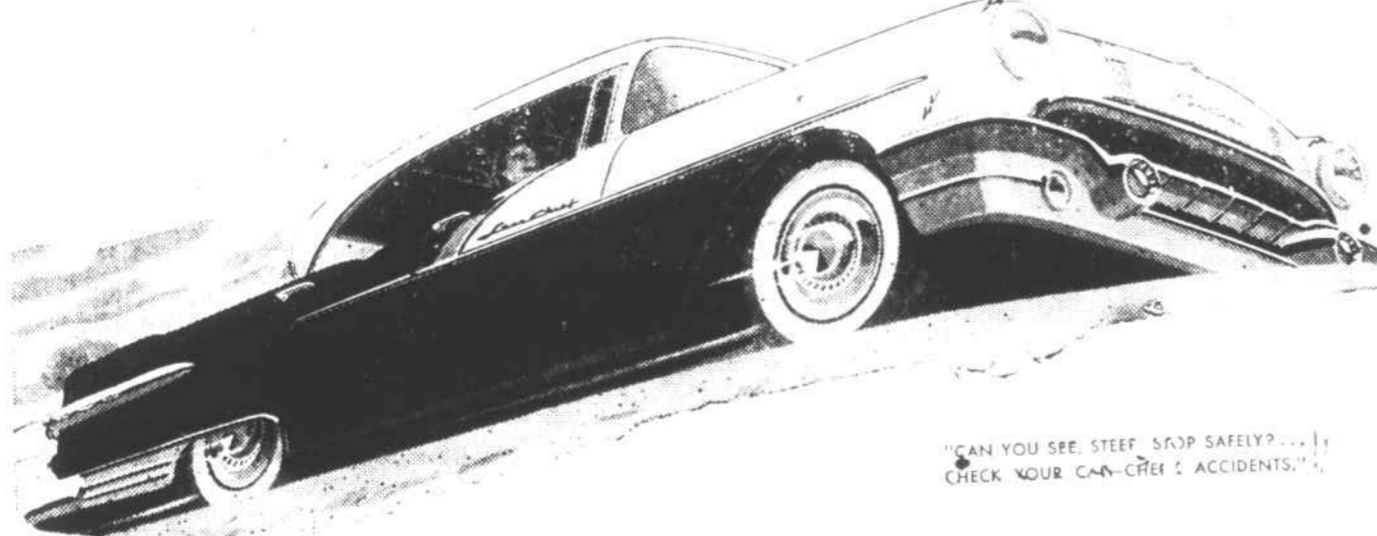
