

And when it jects and who use feed or fertilizer takes no baking, you can't beat it as a desert for these hot August days. To make this delightfully different treat, you'll need 2 envelopes glelatine; 1 cup sugar; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 2 egg yolks; beaten; 1 cup milk; 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind 3 cups creamed cottage cheese (24 Fab ounces); sieved; 1 tablespoon lemon juice; 1 teaspoon vanilla; 2 tablespoons melted butter; 1 tablespoon sugar; 1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs; teaspoon cinnamon; 14 teaspoon ,nutmeg; 2 egg whites, stiffly beaten; and 1 cup heavy cream, whipped. Mix gelatine, sugar, and salt in saucepan. Beat egg yolks, mix with cup of milk, and add to gelatine mixture. Cook on very low heat, stirring constantly till gelatine dis-Liquid solves and mixture thickens (about 10 minutes). Remove from heat and add lemon rind. Cool. Stir in sieved, creamed cheese, lemon juice, and vanilla. Chill, stirring occasionally till mixture mounds slightly when dropped from a spoon. While mitture is chilling, make Cut Style crumb topping by mixing the two tablespoons melted butter, one tablespoon sugar, half cup graham cracker crumbs, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Set aside. Fold egg whites and whipped cream into chilled gelatine mixture. Turn into 8-inch spring form pan, and sprinkle top with crumb mixture. Chill till firm. Yield, 10 to 12 servings. Note: This cheese cake may be, frozen and kept from one to two months. The small amount of time and effort to take a soil sample may save hundreds of dollars in lime and fertilizer as well as in crop
