CHRISTMAS BAZAAR

The Cherokee County Crafters and several Home Demonstration clubs are having a Christmas Bazaar on Saturday, December 7, at 10:00 a. m. at Walter Coleman's Appliance Store.

Come in and do some Christmas shopping or pick up baked and canned foods your family will enjoy. Selecting and Making Draperies.

Home Demonstration members examined a wide variety of drapery swatches and were given buying tips and lesson sheets to use as reference material.

They learned that quality of material, colors, pattern scaled to size of room, amount of fullness desirable, and length of draperies (pre-determined by effect desired) all are to be considered before making final selection of fabric.

By day, draperies flatter a window and frame a view but never shut out the natural light. At night draperies provide privacy. Not only must the effect be con-

sidered as a part of the interior decorating scheme but how the draperies look from the outside is important.

This demonstration was well received and the information will apply when future window treatment is considered.

Since draperies do represent a considerable investment of money and time careful planning and good workmanship are important from the time the fabric is selected until the finished drapery is hung.

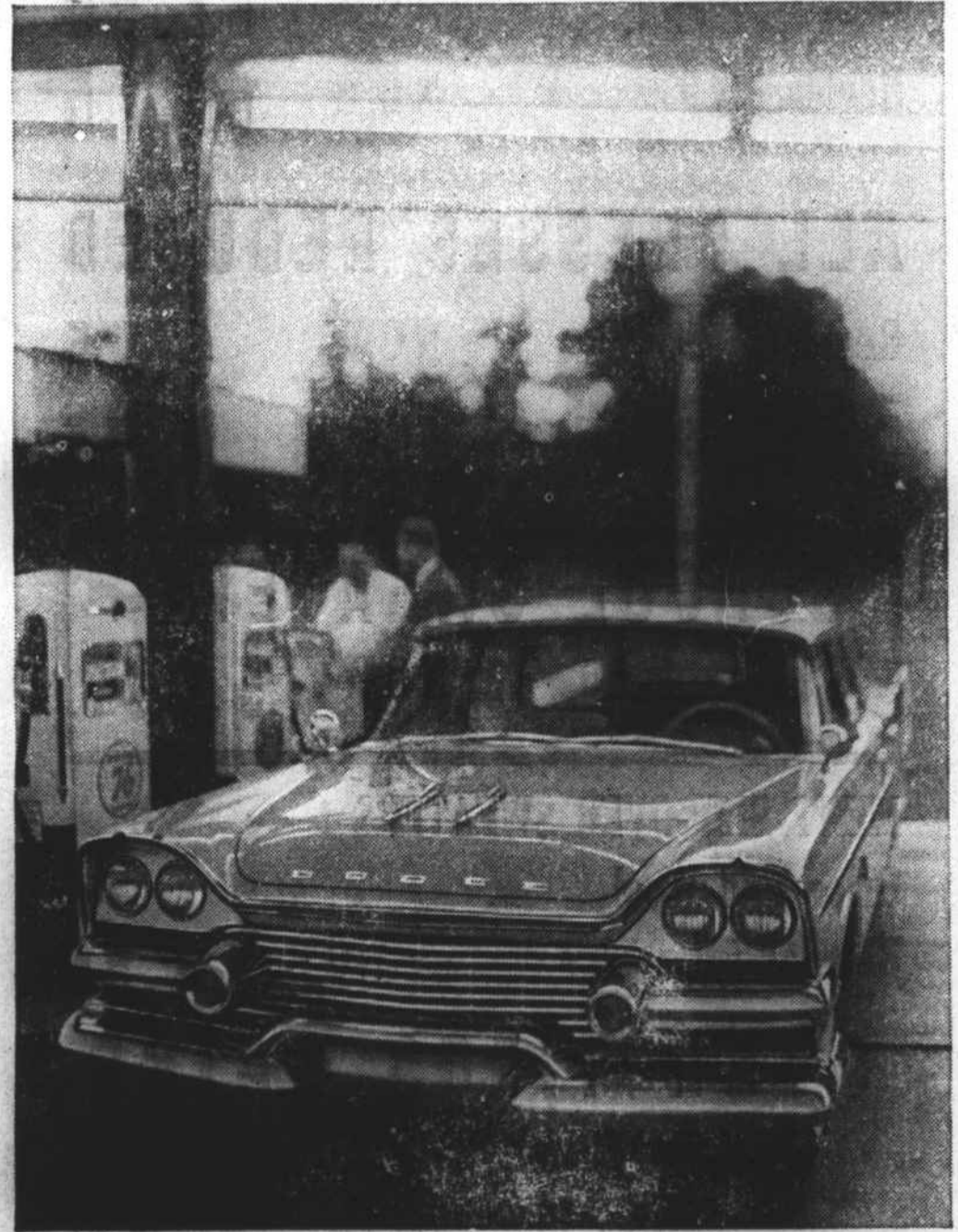
