

## Six New Films Available From Murphy Library

**Heredity and Family Environment**—9 minutes, sound, black and white. This dramatized study of a high school student demonstrates the fact that individuals are joint products of heredity and environment. The film points out that each person has a hand in developing his own nature.

**Historic Mansions of Upland Virginia**—23 minutes, sound-color. In the middle and late 18th century and early 19th century, many Virginia families left their river plantations and built estates on higher ground in the Blue Ridge and the Shenandoah Valley.

**Magnificent Canada Goose**—11 minutes, sound color. The Canada Goose is shown from its migration North through the breeding season to the gathering of the flocks for the migration south. The film shows four major flyways, the breeding grounds, wildlife refuges, and the work of the Wildlife Service and State Conservation Departments.

**Mark Twain: Background for his works**: 13½ minutes, sound, color. Using authentic backgrounds, quotations, and reenactments, this biography contributes to the study of the works of Mark Twain. The variety and color of Twain's boyhood on the Mississippi are shown to be a source of his major writings; his other works, as well, are seen to reflect the rich and zestful life of this journalist, yarnspinner, and humorist.

### Instructions for "Freezing Vegetables"

A folder on Freezing Instructions for Vegetables has been received in the Home Agent's office.

This information prepared by Miss Nita Orr, extension specialist in Food Conservation and Marketing, State College, provides us with the latest research available on this subject.

With many more families acquiring freezers each year it is important that they have the recommended methods for high quality products.

Not all varieties of vegetables lend themselves to freezing. Some varieties are better for canning, some for freezing while some may be either canned or frozen.

Few homemakers can afford to experiment so if you want to take advantage of research this information is available.

For a high quality product check these points: A variety that freezes well, just right to eat fresh, worked fast (from the garden to the freezer), scalded (blanched) right, chilled quickly and thoroughly.

Set containers intended for freezing (not milk cartons or other improvised containers), into freezer soon after packaging, frozen below 0°F, stored at 0°F or cooler until used, put to cook while frozen, cooked 'til just tender.

Result: The best vegetables in the whole, wide world!

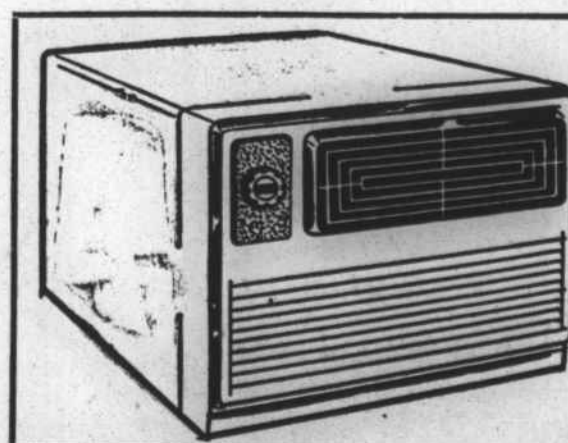
