Two - Way Radios Taken Out Of Cars; Can't Inforce Law, Sheriff Tells

The two deputy sheriffs in Cherokee County have resigned and Sheriff Claude Anderson claims it is now impissible to secure deputies who will work under the recently started fee system.

Mr. Anderson also reported in a prepared statement that the county commissioners have taken the way radios out of the Sheriff departments cars.

The sheriff says he knows of no the jail by order of the Board of reason for this move other than, the County Commissioners and the Sheriffs Department is now without "political."

Mr. Anderson said that law enforcement is all but "impossible" with just one person on duty.
