He was discharged honorably last April and since then had been working for a Washington business firm.

A preacher had been killed—the name was Jesus. Herod saw political advantage, and he had arrested Peter. While he was in jail, the church held a prayer meeting at the home of John Mark's mother. One of the people attending was a girl named Rhoda. She kept the door, and of course was the first to recognize the delinquency of Peter. Thus an humble, though faithful service, was richly re-

warded.
