## Compleste Marine Course

Graduated July 25 from the Junior Platoon Leaders Candidate Course at Marine Corps Schools, Quantico, Va., was Frank Bradley, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alex O. Bradley of Hayesville Route 2.

He joined the Marine Corps Program while a student at Western Carolina College.

He is one of 2,000 students seeking commissions offered by the Marine Corps to selected college students who complete the required mer months and graduate from an military training during the summer months and graduate from an accredited college.

ANSWER: Not as long as you'd think. When you pull weeds, you eliminate the principal source of next year's weeds—the seeds. Keep on pulling them and in a matter of two or three years your garden should be relatively weed-free. Some seeds retain the spark of life for many years, but most of them must be plowed to the surface and given proper germinating conditions.

## COLLEGE HINTS

### VACATION GOOD "COOK TIME"

FOR CHILDREN: Vacation time, when children are always hungry, can be a happy, learning-to-cook time. With recipes geared to their children's skills and appealing to their youthful tastes, they can spend many hours creating their own meals. These tested recipes give excellent results.

Cookies: (Prepared Variety)—the kind to make when it rains and the hours seem long.  
1 cup soft butter  
2/3 cup sugar  
3 egg yolks  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2 1/2 cups sifted enriched self-rising flour

Preheat oven—400 degrees. (1) Cream butter and sugar. (2) Add egg yolks and vanilla. (3) Work in flour with hands. (4) Force dough through cookie press on ungreased baking sheet, using the shapes you like best. (5) Bake 7 to 10 minutes; until set but not brown. (6) Remove to cooling rack, using metal spatula. (Makes 6 dozen).

One-Dish Dinner—made of drop biscuits cooked on top of canned beef stew. Serve with a tossed salad on Mom's night off.

1 1/3 cups sifted enriched self-rising flour  
1/3 cup self-rising corn meal  
3/4 cup shortening  
1/2 to 1/3 cup milk  
Large can beef stew

Preheat oven 425 degrees. (1) Pour beef stew into a casserole dish and place in oven to heat. (2) Mix flour and corn meal together in bowl. (3) Cut in shortening with pastry blender, until mixture is crumbly. (4) Add milk to make a thick batter. (5) Drop spoonfuls of this batter on top of beef stew. (6) Bake about 25 minutes.

### WHIPPED LIME SUNDAES SALAD

(Makes 6 servings)

1 1/2 cups (20-ounce can) pineapple chunks  
1 package (3-ounce) lime-flavored gelatin  
1 cup undiluted evaporated milk

2 tablespoons lemon juice  
1/2 cup chopped walnuts  
1/2 cup mayonnaise  
1 cup seedless grapes

Drain pineapple and reserve 1 cup pineapple syrup (add water if necessary to make 1 cup). Heat pineapple syrup to boiling. Pour over gelatin; stir until dissolved. Chill until thick and syrupy. Chill undiluted evaporated milk in refrigerator tray until ice crystals form around edge (15 to 20 minutes). Whip until stiff (about 1 minute). Add lemon juice, grapes and pineapple gelatin mixture. Fold into whipped evaporated milk. Turn into 2-quart mold. Chill until firm. Unmold.

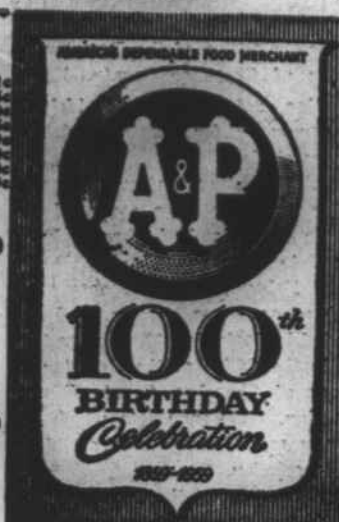
