**High School To Receive Science Books**

Science education will be given additional emphasis during the current year at Murphy High School.

Principal Walter Puett's application for participation in the Traveling High School Science Library Program has been accepted by the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

A set of 200 outstanding, evaluated, up-to-date books in the sciences and mathematics will circulate to the school library from Washington, D. C. All branches of science will be covered and the reading level will range from books the brilliant junior high student will find interest-

ing to some that will give the outstanding high school senior a taste of advanced work. The collection is valued at more than \$1,100.

The 200 books are circulated 50 at a time to four high schools in geographic proximity, the books rotating every two months. In this way new titles with a fresh appeal appear periodically. The books in their traveling cases are on display in the school library, and representatives of PTA, civic groups, service organizations and interested individuals are invited to examine them.

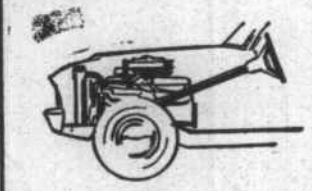

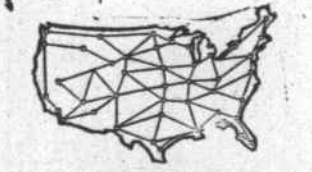
