The Rev. Jack Thomas officiated. Burial was in church cemetery.

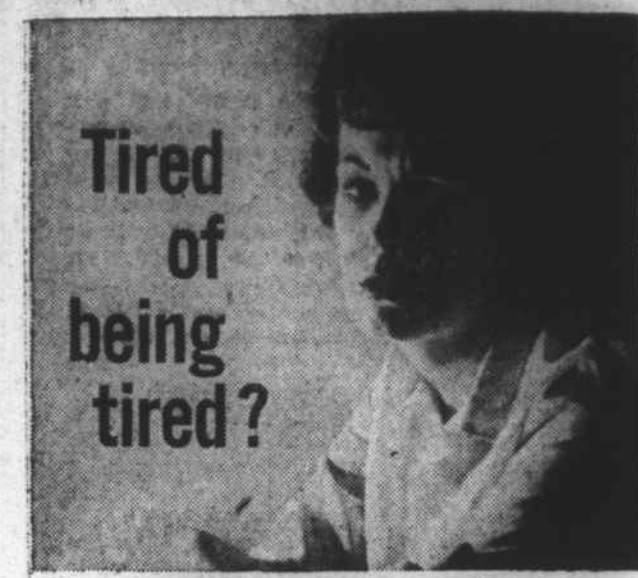
