What's The Score?

Fifty North Carolinians lost their lives in home and farm accidents in August, 1959, according to data just released by the Public Health Statistics Section of the North Carolina State Board of Health.

The total for the first eight months of 1959 is 459 deaths. In 1958 during the first eight months of the year the total from home and farm mishaps was 529 deaths.

All accidents caused 1579 deaths during the first eight months of 1959. Motor vehicle accidents caused 780 deaths; home and farm accidents, 459 deaths; and all other accidents, 349 deaths. The accident death toll for the first eight months of 1959 is slightly less than that for the corresponding period in 1958 when all accidents claimed 1605 lives.
