Book reviews were given by Barbara Caylor, Grace McCoy, Harold Cornwell, Tripp Bourne and Orlan Cornwell.

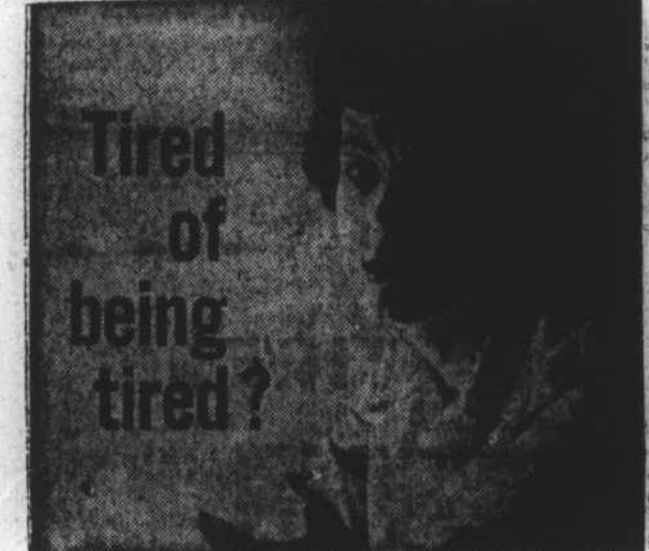
