**Industry Forester To Head Tar Heel Tree Farm Plans**  
RALEIGH (Special) — Donnie L. Todd, conservation forester for International Paper Co., Wilmington, has been appointed chairman of the North Carolina Tree Farm Committee.

He succeeds J. Ray Orr, timber conservation supervisor for Champion Paper and Fibre Co., Canton, who recently was named chairman of the North Carolina Forest Industries Committee.

The Tree Farm committee of graduate foresters administers the program of growing trees as a crop on private lands under the sponsorship of the North Carolina FIC.

The North Carolina program is part of the American Tree Farm System, active in 47 states with more than 16,000 Tree Farms and over 51 million acres of well-managed timberlands enrolled.

Launched in North Carolina in 1944, the industry-sponsored program here now has 506 certified Tree Farms covering more than a million acres. Cooperating with the North Carolina committee are the Agricultural Extension Service and the North Carolina Division of Forestry.

Todd is a graduate of the University of Georgia with a master's degree in forestry.
