### ST. VALENTINE'S APPLE SPICE CAKE . . .



Observe this Valentine Party cake. It is romantic looking on the outside, contains a flash of spice on the inside . . . as fine a formula for romance as it is for cake.

Under the pink, elegant frosting and heart decorations is a cake tangy with chopped apple slices, raisins and nuts. Yet with it all, the cake is soft, light and rises cloud high.

Minus its Valentine decorations, this cake can grace any party. In fact, any occasion it's served practically becomes a party. Happily, too, the cake is easy and fun to make. Here's how it goes.

**Ingredients:**  
 3/4 cup butter  
 1 1/2 cups sugar  
 3 eggs, large  
 3 cups sifted all-purpose flour  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 1 1/2 teaspoon baking soda  
 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon  
 1 1/2 teaspoons nutmeg  
 1/2 teaspoon cloves  
 1/2 cup milk  
 1 1/4 cups finely chopped canned apple slices  
 1/2 cup chopped walnut meats  
 1/2 cup seedless raisins  
 Confectioners' Sugar Frosting  
 Chocolate Candy Hearts

**Directions:**  
 Cream together butter and sugar; add eggs, one at a time, beating after each. Sift together flour, salt, baking soda, cinnamon, nutmeg and cloves. Add to creamed mixture alternately with milk. Mix to smooth batter. Add apples, nut meats and raisins. Mix well. Pour into greased and floured 9" or 10" tube pan. Bake in moderate oven, 325 degrees, 60 to 70 minutes. Cool 10 minutes. Remove to wire rack. When cold, decorate: Tint confectioners' sugar frosting a delicate pink with red vegetable coloring. Reserve 1/2 cup to be tinted a darker pink. Smooth frosting over cake. Tint remaining frosting dark pink and press through rose tip of pastry tube and make heart design of roses on side of cake; also put a row of roses around bottom of cake. Place candy hearts on top. Makes 18-20 servings.
