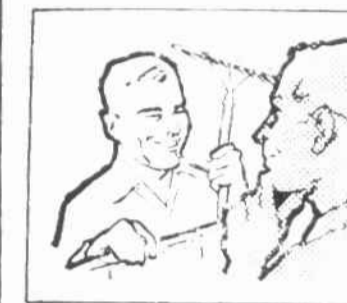


Murphy Garden Club Meets With Mrs. W. A. Hoover
