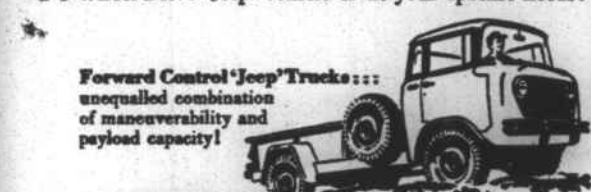

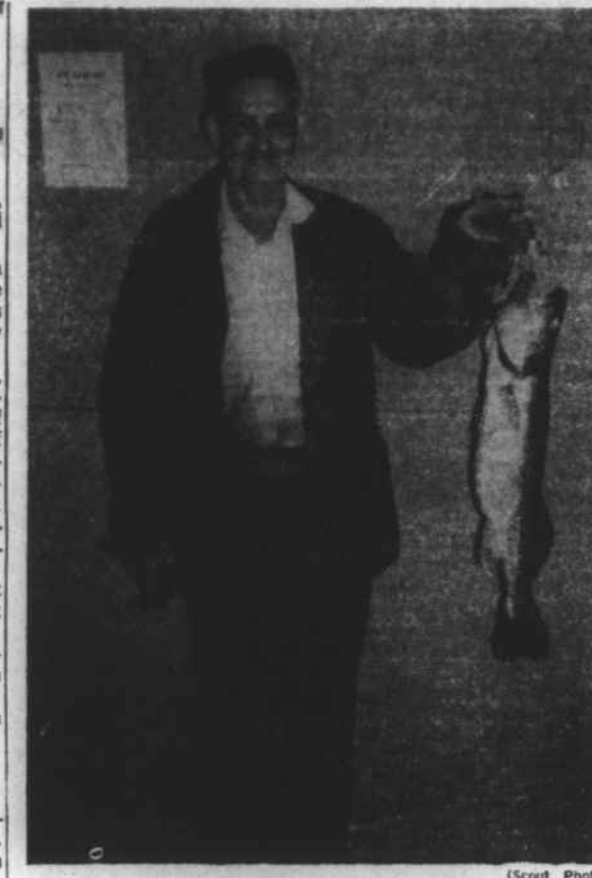
**\$10,000 Bond Set For Truman Cole**

At four o'clock Saturday afternoon, Dr. and Mrs. Paul A. Reid will entertain with a tea for seniors, alumni, guests and faculty at the president's home on the campus.

The annual senior-alumni banquet has been set for six o'clock in the college cafeteria. A special feature of this event will be the presentation of distinguished service awards to two alumni, one in the field of education and one in another field. Recipients of these awards have been chosen confidentially, and will not be announced to the public until time for the presentation.

A faculty concert, presented by members of the music department, will be given in Hoey Auditorium at 8:30 Saturday evening.

The Reverend James Y. Perry, Jr., of Asheville, educator-missioner of the Episcopal Diocese of Western North Carolina, will deliver the baccalaureate sermon in Hoey Auditorium at eleven o'clock Sunday morning.
