Parent Benefits

By GRADY GRUBBS

Field Representative A dependent parent may be entitled to monthly payments under the Social Security Act if certain qualifying conditions are met. These benefits may be paid in addition to any paid the surviving widow and children.

First, the son (or daughter) on hose record the parent is claiming benefits must have died fully insured. In addition, the deceased must have furnished at least onehalf the parent's total support in 12-month period just before

This support requirement, simply stated, means that the parent must have received as much support from the deceased as he received from all other sources combined. All other sources of income to the parent must be considered in arriving at the support requirement. This may include self-employment income of the parent, dages, rents, and payments received from other

and payments received from other government agencies. A claim and proof of dependency must be filed within two years after the age earner's death,

If the parent has reached retirement age (65 for men, 62 for women), proof of age will also be needed. If the parent has not reached retirement age, proof of dependency still must be filed within the two-year limit.
