

Polio is a disease of the non immunized, says Dr. W. S. Cann. In an interview today, Dr. W. S. Cann, Health Director of Chcrokee, Clay, and Graham Health District, cautioned parents of small children against the belief that polio was no longer a real danger in our area. Dr. Cann explained that, as more and more children and adults in our area are protected against polio through immunization, those without shots have less opportunity to build natural immunity against the disease in childhood. 
Brumby Mills Awarded Gov't Contract
