The newly formed Cherokee County Rescue Squad voted to adopt the by-laws as presented at a meeting held last Thursday night.
The squad in an appeal to the public for funds raised pledges of \$400, the use of an ambulance, and one crowbar.
The rescue is composed of volunteers and must operate from funds donated by the public. All present the squad's desperate cry short of its goal to obtain the minimum amount of equipment. Any donation will be appreciated. Call or see Jim Ed Hughes, president of the squad.
The By-Laws of the Rescue Squad as adopted are as follows:
NAME—The organization shall be called CHEROKEE COUNTY RESCUE SQUAD, INC., a North Carolina Corporation.
PURPOSE—The objective of the organization shall be to serve at any time upon proper request for any mission of mercy, to aid and assist in event of disaster or accident where human life is or has been endangered, when such aid appears to be within the capacity of the organization.
Cherokee County will have priority on our services. The decision will be made by the Captain of the squad whether to respond to calls for aid from outside the County. One unit of the squad shall be retained in the County at all times.
MEMBERSHIP—Members of the squad shall be limited to residents of Cherokee County. Male, 21 years of age or older.
Honorary Members will be elected by a majority vote of the Board of Directors, and a three-fourths vote of the members present.
OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS—Executive powers shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

The officers shall be: One Captain, Two 1st Lieutenants, two 2nd Lieutenants, two Sergeants for each unit.
The Board of Directors shall be seven (7) members elected by a majority of the membership.
AMENDMENTS—Amendments to the By-Laws shall be submitted in writing by any member to the Board of Directors prior to a regular meeting. At the next regular meeting of the Corporation the proposal shall be presented for discussion. Vote shall be deferred to the following meeting. A two-thirds majority vote of all members shall be necessary to amend the By-Laws.
BY-LAWS OF THE CHEROKEE COUNTY RESCUE SQUAD, INC. ELECTION OF NEW MEMBERS
When a vacancy exists, two members may endorse the name of a candidate in writing to the Board of Directors for vote. A majority will nominate; in case of a tie the Captain will cast the deciding vote.
Vote of majority of the membership is necessary to elect nominee.
Where more than one candidate is nominated for a vacancy, candidate or candidates receiving the greatest number of votes shall be elected.
ELECTION OF OFFICERS—The officer for the first year only shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. Election of officers shall for the second and each succeeding year be held at the first meeting in July.
Candidates for offices shall be nominated from the floor and vote shall be by shown of hands with candidates withdrawn from the room. Nomination shall be for other officers' posts through the officer roster. A majority vote of those present will elect.
MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT—Members must abide by the By-Laws.
Each member must have in his possession a valid squad card. New and old members shall have six months in which to secure a valid card.
Resignation must be submitted in writing to the Board of Directors.
ELECTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS—Election of the Board of Directors shall be by the same procedure as for officers.
The Board Chairman shall be elected from two or more nominees from the newly elected Board. The nominee receiving the majority of votes shall be the Chairman.
In event of the resignation of any officer or Board members, any officer or Board member, the Board shall be empowered to appoint a successor to serve the unexpired term.
DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY-TREASURER AND ASSISTANT SECRETARY—It shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer to maintain adequate records of attendance at all activities; to record the minutes of each meeting of the Squad and of the Board of Directors; to receive, record, and disburse funds as directed by the Board.
The Secretary-Treasurer shall be bonded in the amount of \$1,000.
In the absence or at the direction of the Secretary-Treasurer, the Assistant Secretary shall perform necessary secretarial duties.
When circumstances prevent the Secretary-Treasurer from performing his disbursing duties, the Chairman of the Board shall be authorized, as directed by the Board, to sign checks for bills payable.
DUTIES OF OFFICERS—The Captain shall be in complete charge of all equipment, training, and rescue missions. His duty and authority will be assumed in his absence by the next ranking officer of each unit.
DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS—The Directors shall act as the governing body controlling policies and expenditures, and shall determine methods of conducting all activities according to the By-Laws.
The Board of Directors shall have the power to suspend any member of officer within the units upon recommendation by officers of the unit to the Board of Directors.
Temporary suspension will be made immediately by officers at the time and place of infraction, with a fair hearing at a later date by the Board of Directors, officers, of the unit concerned, and the member charged with the offense. The decision of the Board of Directors after such hearing shall be final.
REGULATIONS AND DISCIPLINE—Good attendance will be expected and required for scheduled training and meetings. Valid reasons for absence will be given the officer or officers, and in advance were possible. Habitual absences will result in suspension.
Discipline will result from infraction of any of the following: (a) Intoxication or intoxicants used during meetings or missions. (b) Flagrant misconduct that would bring discredit to the Squad. (c) Violation of By-Laws, rules and regulations.
No equipment shall be used other than for training or rescue missions.
UNIFORM—Each member shall have a prescribed uniform, as selected by the members of the organization, and the adopted uniform shall be worn at all activities and rescue missions.
