Who Is BOB GAVIN?



Robert L. (Bob) Gavin

He is the man the Republican party of North Carolina selected for its candidate for Governor in 1960 because he is qualified to serve with distinction as chief executive of the State. He was educated in Sanford public schools and the University of North Carolina; a prominent and successful Lawyer, a veteran of World War II, United States District Attorney 1954 to 1958. He distinguished himself in public service by prosecuting and convicting the Communist leader, Junius Scales. His particular interest is in improving education for three good reasons: Edwin, age 10, Grace, age 7, and John, age 6. He is a member of the First Baptist Church of Sanford, N. C.

WHAT DOES BOB GAVIN BELIEVE?

Bob Gavin stands immovable on certain basic principles, one of which is financial responsibility. In no case does the Republican Administration in North Carolina intend to spend more money than it can take in under its tax structure. The Republican Administration intends to explore the possibility of tax reductions for the individual. Corporations have had some tax relief in this state, and Bob Gavin feels that the tax load of the individual should be reduced, if possible. The Republican Administration, both national and state, maintains tax cuts must come during times of national prosperity. This we have now. If reductions are not made now, we will never have tax reduction.

With respect to public education, Bob Gavin stated emphatically: "I have said several times during this campaign, and I believe the first time was at a Board of Education meeting in Albermarle, that it would be tragic to close the public schools in North Carolina. I will do everything in my power to keep the public schools open so that the children of this state can receive their education at state expense".

With reference to Independents, or Democrats for Gavin, when Robert L. Gavin is the next Governor of North Carolina, it will be his purpose to make all policy-level appointments on the basis of merit. Democrats shall NOT be excluded. In non-policy appointments, he will retain the qualified personnel in all departments.
