Words of Life

C. A. SMITH, Pastor, Murphy Methodist Circuit The First Psalm gives us an excellent picture of a good man. It also gives to us some of the characteristics of God. Whenever and wherever you find a person whose life is nurtured by his faith in God, you will find at least three outstanding qualities of life present.

First, a person whose faith is anchored in God is firm. He is firm in his faith, firm in his beliefs, firm in his character. Without doubt, he is like a tree that is planted, not as seed cast against the winds, whose very life depends on the benevolence of nature. He is planted and cared for until he can stand erect and face the terrific forces of the elements—sun and wind and rain. Planted. What a suggestion of strength is implied in the word itself! We can picture the roots of a tree as they strike deeper and deeper, and spread wider and wider, in the fertile soil about them. This is an act of health and strength and growth. So it is with the lives of people who are firm in their faith, strong in their convictions, and courageous in their efforts "to make a go of life."

Second, a good tree is fruitful. So is a good man. Sometimes the fruit growers of the United States have disappointing years. Trees which in former years were laden with fruits, happen to bear none. At times there is a reason for it; again, there is no explanation at all. How many times have we seen people who resemble such trees? They have great gifts of body, mind, and soul. And in addition to this, fortune has been very kind to them. But judged from an accurate, discerning standpoint, they must be classified as the world's most bitter failures. There are others whose lives are rooted in the Law and Love of God, and the world is a better place because they live in it. They bring forth fruit, the only kind that counts. I have seen old apple trees bent, gnarled and twisted, yet they bear the sweetest apples any person ever ate. As I ate the apples, I forgot the blemishes and the scars of the tree. I had to look on with mingled pity and admiration for a tree which was faithful in fruit-bearing in spite of all its handicaps. I have seen other apple trees which were beautiful and pretentious, yet as barren as a fence post. Have you seen the same? You know, God judges us, not by the profession on our lips, but by the occupation of our hearts.

Third, a good tree does not wither, for it is planted by the rivers of water. A good person has freshness of spirit and soul. The Psalmist gives the picture of a tree whose leaves remain green, not only for a year, but for the lifetime of the tree. Man cannot have freshness of spirit and soul unless his life is lived consistently with the Divine purpose. Look at the person whose life does not wither. Ask him how in the evening of life he is able to keep the zest and vigor of youth. Ask him how he finds life more and more meaningful and increasingly blessed as the years come and go. He will tell you the secret. "I live with God, so life can never become stale."

Fourth people were asked to give a picture of the happiest person on earth. One person said it would be a mother rocking her baby to sleep at the end of day. Another said it would be a craftsman, whistling over a job well done. The third said it would be a child, building sand houses. The fourth person said it would be a surgeon who had just successfully finished a serious operation. In each instance of happiness the persons became so interested in what they were doing that they lost sight of themselves. Dr. Robert E. Speer on a return trip from India remarked that he could pick out the Christians there by the light which they had on their face. The countenance on our faces reveals so much about the condition of our soul. What a wretched world we would have if there were not those in our midst who have strength and freshness of character. The story is told of a British General who stood with one of his staff officers on a hill in Palestine. The officer asked the General, "What does this land really need?" The General replied with one word, "Trees." What more does the world need today, or any day, than people from all walks of life who will stand as trees by the waters, who beautify our civilizations and hold them together, who enrich our heritage for generations?

ASC News

By EVELYN SUDDERTH, Acting Office Manager We realize that all farmers in our section are wanting to see some rain fall on their farms to save their crops. We are hearing complaints every day about the shortage of hay crop due to the dry weather this summer and the drying up of pastures and meadows. This may be the reason that some of our farmers have not been in to get materials for their farms, such as lime, fertilizer and seeds so far this season. We are getting good results from the last letter we mailed to all non-participating farmers but we would like to get all of you farmers taking part in the ACP program. We often wonder if you realize that the more farmers that participate in the ACP program the more money Cherokee County will receive for carrying out practices in the county. Therefore we need every farm in the county taking part in the program. Let's build up our farms and have good pastures and meadows and at the same time prevent erosion of our land. Winter rains can do lots of damage by washing away the top soil when the land is standing idle or unprotected. A good cover crop will prevent this on your corn fields. We have a practice for furnishing crimson clover, hairy vetch, annual ryegrass or small grains which will also furnish good grazing for your livestock early next spring. This is one way you farmers can overcome the shortage of feed for your cattle which is being caused this year by the dry weather. Do you have any land that is suitable for setting out young tree seedlings? Come to the ASC office and let us give you the order blank for getting the trees delivered to your farm. The ACP program pays \$12 per acre to the farmer for setting out the seedlings. Always remember to come to the ASC office and make your request in writing and get your approval before starting your work as this is the only way federal cost-sharing can be approved. Now long has it been since you took soil samples of your farmland? More than likely you

When services like this are available can you afford to let your grasses starve for lack of plant food?
