MODERN ETIQUETTE

Q. Is it permissible to mail one wedding invitation to an engaged couple, or must each be sent an individual invitation?

A. Correctly, they are sent separate invitations -- but if you are running low on invitations, it would not be improper to send one invitation. In this case, you address the outside envelope to the girl, as "Miss Sally Woods," and the inner envelope to "Miss Woods and Mr. John F. Patterson."

Q. When eating with the fork, is it all right to spear the pieces of meat with the fork held prongs-down?

A. While it is all right to spear the meat with down-pointing prongs, you must be certain to lift the fork to the mouth with the prongs upward.

Q. When house guests from out-of-town are expected in on the train or plane, are they supposed to be met at the station or terminal by the host or hostess?

A. Most certainly.

Q. Our teen-aged children are giving us a Silver Wedding Anniversary reception soon, and it is likely that some of the guests will bring gifts. Are we supposed to open these gifts at once and display them?

A. Since people who bring gifts like to witness the pleasure of those receiving them, it is usually nice to open them as soon as possible and display them to the other guests.

Q. When I have borrowed a

needle and thread from the attendant in a powder room, in order to make some minor repair, am I supposed to tip the attendant?

A. Yes, this is expected.

Q. When a man is sitting at the bar in a cocktail lounge, is he supposed to tip the bar man?

A. While not exactly necessary, it still seems to be expected in some places -- and especially when one's change is returned in a small tray.

Q. My husband has been asked to serve as godfather to a friend's child. Should the silver cup he is giving the baby be engraved as just from my husband, or should my name be included?

A. Since the cup is from the godfather alone, it should be marked as from him. No additional gift is required from you.

Q. When a guest shows no signs of pleasure, and even fails to thank his hostess properly, is there any way for the hostess to make him see how he stands in her estimation?

A. Her best procedure in this instance is not to invite him again soon -- or ever!

Q. Is it necessary to mail engraved wedding invitations to close friends who have already been invited verbally?

A. It is ALWAYS correct to mail engraved invitations -- even to members of the immediate families.
